STATUTORY TESTING

Well done to our Y2 and Y6 pupils for completing their statutory assessments. Our Y1s are currently completing their phonics screening tests. The results from these assessments will be shared in the end of year report which is due to go out on **Thursday 11th July**.

BREAKFAST CLUB

It is brilliant to see that Breakfast Club is so popular however this does mean that we are frequently reaching capacity. If you know that you need child care could we please ask you to book in advance (preferably 24hours). We have also had children who have not attended, even though they have been booked in, when this place could have been given to another child.

Please note that if your child is booked in for the second session (from 8am) they must not attend earlier due to staffing ratios.

BOOK LEVELS

It is really important that parents listen to their children read and it makes a significant



difference to their learning and should never be under-estimated.

Could we please ask that you follow School's guidance on the colour that your child should be reading from. This is linked closely to their phonics phase (knowledge of sounds and words). It can be detrimental to a child's learning, if faced with a text they are not prepared for.

If you think that your child needs to move up a reading level, please have a conversation with your child's class teacher. Following on from this the teacher will complete a running record which will decide if your child needs to move on to the next level.



It is usual that at any one time 5% of children in a school will always have head lice. The best way to deal with the problem is to set a time where all children of the School are checked at the same time and any issues are dealt with.

Current guidance from County actually states that even if children have live lice that they should still attend school as they would have had them for up to three weeks previously. It also states that school should not inform parents through "alert letters" when there is an outbreak as these letters could potentially need to be sent out every day, this could also lead to parents attempting to treat their children preventatively which is neither effective or advised, which is why we have Bug Busting Days instead.

For us as a School to finally get rid of this problem it needs everybody to work together and also for everybody to know how to effectively get rid of the lice and the eggs (nits.)

Please ensure that you check your child's hair over this weekend for a Bug Busting Clean-Up!

ATTENDANCE UPDATE

96.7% Our attendance is currently in-line with the National Average which is really encouraging.

Throughout the year we have had a number of holiday requests which have been counted as unauthorised absence. This is because the reason for the holiday cannot be classed as "exceptional circumstances." I totally appreciate that for many families finance is the main reason for holidays during term time, but unfortunately this does not constitute as an exceptional circumstance. I would please ask you to think about the impact that having time away from School has on your child's education, particularly if their attendance is not "green."

Cumbria County Council School Absence Enforcement Policy (available on our website) states that:

If the leave is taken a Fixed Penalty Notice may be issued for the unauthorised leave of absence providing the following criteria apply:

- There have been 10 sessions (5 consecutive days) or more of unauthorised absence due to leave taking during an academic year.
- The overall attendance figures for a reasonable period (minimum half a term) would support the issuing of a penalty notice. Or:
- It is the second leave taken in any one academic year totalling more than five days absence
