#### Our topic this term is:

# **Global Gardens and Awesome Africa**

We will be finding out about life cycles of plants and animals focusing on the life cycle of a frog. We already have lots of tiny tadpoles in our outdoor area to take care of! We will also be planting some seeds to grow our own food. Jack and the Beanstalk will be taking over our classroom, supporting us with our story telling and writing. We will find out about Van Gogh and learn how to paint Sunflowers, just like he did! After half term we will be 'going to Africa'. Preparing our passports, packing our suit cases and taking an imaginary flight to meet 'Sunny' the Meerkat and his family in the Kalahari Desert. We will learn about the climate, houses and animals in Africa, make our own African jewellery, learn African dances and discover African food!
