OUR TOPICS FOR THIS TERM ARE: Summer 1: Above and below the clouds

Summer 2: From here to there



Our topic for the first half term is **'Above and below the**

clouds'. During this topic, we will be beginning to explore space. We will talk about different planets, how to get to space, how we can take care of our planet Earth. We will discuss asteroids and then dive into a mini topic about dinosaurs! We will explore when they lived, their fossils and different types of dinosaurs.

After May half term, our topic will be **'From here to there'.** This topic is all about travel. We will find out ways of travelling in vehicles, we will look at rescue vehicles, transport in the past and then we will talk about traveling to other countries and take a closer look at Mexico and how this is similar or different to our country. In **maths** this term, we will be focussing on numbers beyond 10, number patterns, adding and taking away, doubling, even and odds and rotating shapes.

In English this term, we will continue with our Read. Write, Inc (RWI) groups as well as re-telling stories using story maps. We will learn about finger spaces and full stops to help us with this too. Our traditional tale for the first half term will be the 3 little pigs.
