Spring Term Open Afternoon: 18.03.24 - 2:45pm-3:15pm

Wishing you all a very happy new year! Our topic for the first half term is 'Ocean explorers'. We will be exploring marine life, discussing marine pollution and how we can protect the environment. We will dive into a mini topic on pirates and look at pirate history in Whitehaven. During this topic, we will explore maps, make our own and then try following the maps. We will explore sinking and floating and find out what materials sink and float the best. The children will explore water transportation; submarines and boats. We will also have a visit from a local coastguard to discuss their role in the community.



After February half term, our topic will be 'Step into Spring'.



During this topic we will learn all about the seasons, especially Spring. We will talk about how the weather and environment changes. We will explore the lifecycle of a plant and the lifecycle of a frog by keeping our own tadpoles then releasing them. We will also explore Spring celebrations such as: Mother's Day, Holi Festival and Easter. We will visit a local farm and talk about animals that live on a farm and how they change during Spring.

In maths this term, we will be focussing on comparing numbers to 5, the composition of numbers to 5 and comparing mass and capacity!

In English this term, we will continue with our Read, Write, Inc (RWI) groups as well as re-telling stories using story maps. We will continue to learn about finger spaces and full stops to help us with this too. Our traditional tale for the first half term will be Little Red Riding Hood and for the second half term, it will be Jack and The Beanstalk.


Learning to read is all about practise!

How can you help?

Read stories about under the sea, discuss the animals, environment and transport at sea.

Look out of the window/go outside and talk about how the weather and seasons may be changing.

Talk about water pollution and how we can help the sea. Explore maps and talk about how we use them and why. Any opportunities to use maths and numbers in a practical context at home is super!

Support and encourage your child to have a go at writing simple words/ sentences using their letter knowledge and Fred Fingers.

Any additional blending opportunities using Fred talk will be beneficial for your child's learning!
